

FAME Grants Awarded

The Holy Cross Sisters USA Province has announced three Catholic Schools that are recipients of FAME (Formation and Ministry Enablement) Grants totaling \$3,000. In order to be eligible there had to be a current presence of sisters or associates in the city or where Holy Cross Sisters and associates taught. Schools were asked how the money would be used. Six schools applied for the grant and the Holy Cross Sisters voted on the responses not knowing who submitted them.

The top three schools with the highest vote total each received \$1,000. The winning schools are: All Saints Catholic School, Antigo, Wisconsin; De La Salle High School, New Orleans; and Mater Dei High School, Breese, Illinois.

Casey Meidl, a teacher at All Saints Catholic School, said the money would be used to help the Discipleship Club at the school. "We will bring in speakers, take students on pilgrimages, and provide materials for the group," Meidl said. The students have and will continue to carry out some service projects as well. They have already made shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child, created cards for the homebound, and are in the process of raising money for the Humane Society.
